14 Global Arts Engagement Stations: featuring Adama's Tailor Shop

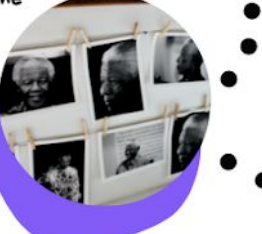

17 Huichol Art Stairs

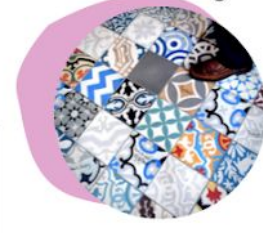
Look up, of course hold on the rail, and experience the most vibrant stair bottoms we've even seen! These was created by Ponkho, drawing inspiration from The Huichols, an indigenous people who mostly live in mountains of Jalisco and Nayarit in north central Mexico. Their numbers are estimated at 50,000. Huichol is derived from the word Wirriarik, which means soothsayer or medicine man in the Huichol language.

18 The Welcome Station

Did you notice the LEAF Global Arts logo? The design is called Imigongo which is the traditional pattern of Rwanda. Historically crafted and designed out of stone/cement & made all by women. LEAF's logo was created by Jean-Paul Alonga & Mika Twizerimana, local graphic designers and former LEAF Rwanda ONEmic Studio Engineer. Can you find the Mexican Pasta Tiles?
